REEC Year 12 Agriculture excursion 2019

Year 12 Agriculture students visited REEC recently to study Land Degradation issues. Mr Darron Watt took them on an informative tour of the old Soil Conservation Station. Students could see first hand the effect of sustainable agricultural practices which are used to manage salinity and soil erosion. They saw the complex picture of how by doing one thing on a farm such as planting trees will have flow on effects either positive or negative to the next property. Our students took soil samples for texture, salinity and pH and were shown how important it is to farm according to your land's capability. Two new technologies were then shown to the students. Drones are being used on the station, which show the effect of the drought on the pine and native forests and trends throughout. The students were able to have a 'play' with the Augmented reality sandbox (pictured below) which allows students to see how they can manage rain and water flow through properties.
