School Improvements

Tumut High School will be one of the latest schools in the state to have its security boosted with new fencing. The Department of Education has announced that the fence will be installed during June. The fence will be of a black, tubular steel design, identical to fences installed at other public schools in rural, regional and metropolitan areas. The Department of Education is progressively upgrading fencing at schools across the state. Gundagai South Public School, also in the Riverina region, is currently benefiting from a fencing upgrades. Priority for fencing is assessed based on a range of data gathered by the Department. The upgraded fencing aims to better protect the significant assets invested in school facilities as well as improving safety of students, staff and visitors during and after school hours. While the fence will limit unauthorised access to school grounds, Tumut High School and the Department of Education recognise that school grounds can be a venue for community sporting and recreation activities. Once the fencing is completed, the school will look for ways to facilitate access by sporting groups and other potential users. In the future, the security fence will provide a safe environment for the school and the community to enjoy the green space within the school grounds.

School Fee Information

Statements of Account have been mailed to families with itemised outstanding amounts.

Once you have received your statement, payment can be made by cash, cheque or EFTPOS at the front office, or via the online payment option on our website or Skoolbag App. If you have not received your statement by the end of the term and you are aware of outstanding amounts, please contact the office.

Account procedures are as follows:

- If justified, refunds for excursions/activities not attended can be reallocated to 'Fees in Advance" and remain available to pay for other activities/fees, rather than being formerly refunded. This is now the preferred departmental practice and has been popular with parents who have faced this circumstance in recent months.
- 2. A family waiver can now be applied to the General Contribution. The Principal, Mr Dixon, has authorised a 25% discount for each of the 2nd, 3rd and 4th siblings in a family. This waiver is applied as follows: the oldest child in the family will be levied 100% of the General Contribution fee applicable to them, and siblings will each be charged 75% of the applicable General Contribution fee.
- 3. General contribution although the School General Contribution is voluntary, payment of this fee is appreciated as monies received are used to purchase teaching resources including textbooks and software, classroom furniture, equipment and fittings for the school such as photocopiers, computers, ovens, sporting equipment, seating etc as well as the purchase of paper, first aid supplies and the printing of all school reports and certificates.
- 4. Subject specific Fees monies used to purchase consumable items accessed by students doing specific subjects. For example, food items in Food Technology, timber and metal in Industrial Arts, paint in Visual Arts, etc. These fees are compulsory as they are costs incurred by individual students. Students and parents are advised of these fees at the time of subject selection.
- 5. Excursion eligibility In accordance with the fees policy, eligibility for some excursions and school activities requires the payment of all elective course fees. For excursions in Term 2 and beyond, 2019 elective course fees must also be paid in full. If you are experiencing financial difficulty please contact the Principal to discuss the payment of your fees.

Sport Levy - In 2019, all students in Year 9 & 10 will be required to pay a sport levy of \$45. This is to pay for hire of various facilities in town for Wednesday afternoon sport and transportation to venues by Bus. This levy will result in students paying less overall for sport compared to previous years. All students will be encouraged to participate in a sport off site during the year. If you have any questions regarding this levy please contact Sports Organiser Mr Ryan.
