At the time of writing, we can announce that Mr Leon Douglas has been appointed as one of these mentors, with the second mentor to be announced in the near future.



The approach of Clontarf has proven to be very effective not only in attracting young men to school and retaining them, but also in having them embrace more disciplined, purposeful and healthy lifestyles. We look forward to working with and supporting Clontarf in the years to come as the programme matures and becomes a permanent fixture in our community.
